This instant I have received Ld. George Germain's Account of Ld. Cornwallis being arrived at Lambeth and that he is tomorrow to be at Elven with Ld. George, as on any other Officers that are here on parade have been presented and as I do not lay any thing at the Charge of Ld. Cornwallis I cannot see why he shall not be presented at my levee tomorrow; Ld. George will therefore appoint him to be there.

I have as yet no account of what has passed between Ld. George Germain and Ld. North, nor indeed the smallest guess what Ld. North meant to say ~~on this~~ occasion, therefore can add nothing but that the expressions of Duty and Attachment in the note met with my thorough Thanks.
