Mr Robinson has just been with me & told me all he had learnt from Lord North of the conference with Lord of G. G. G. It appears to have been very amicable, & as far as I can understand they differ'd less on American Politics than might have been expected. They differ'd more on the Person who was to have the Command in America; & of G. G. G. proposing to Genl. Carleton & proposing a form which if he could be set at liberty, or Genl. Vaughan. Upon the whole I cannot with any certainty inform your Majesty, what will be the issue; but if no one interposes so as to retard its progress, I think that every thing may go on as it is.
