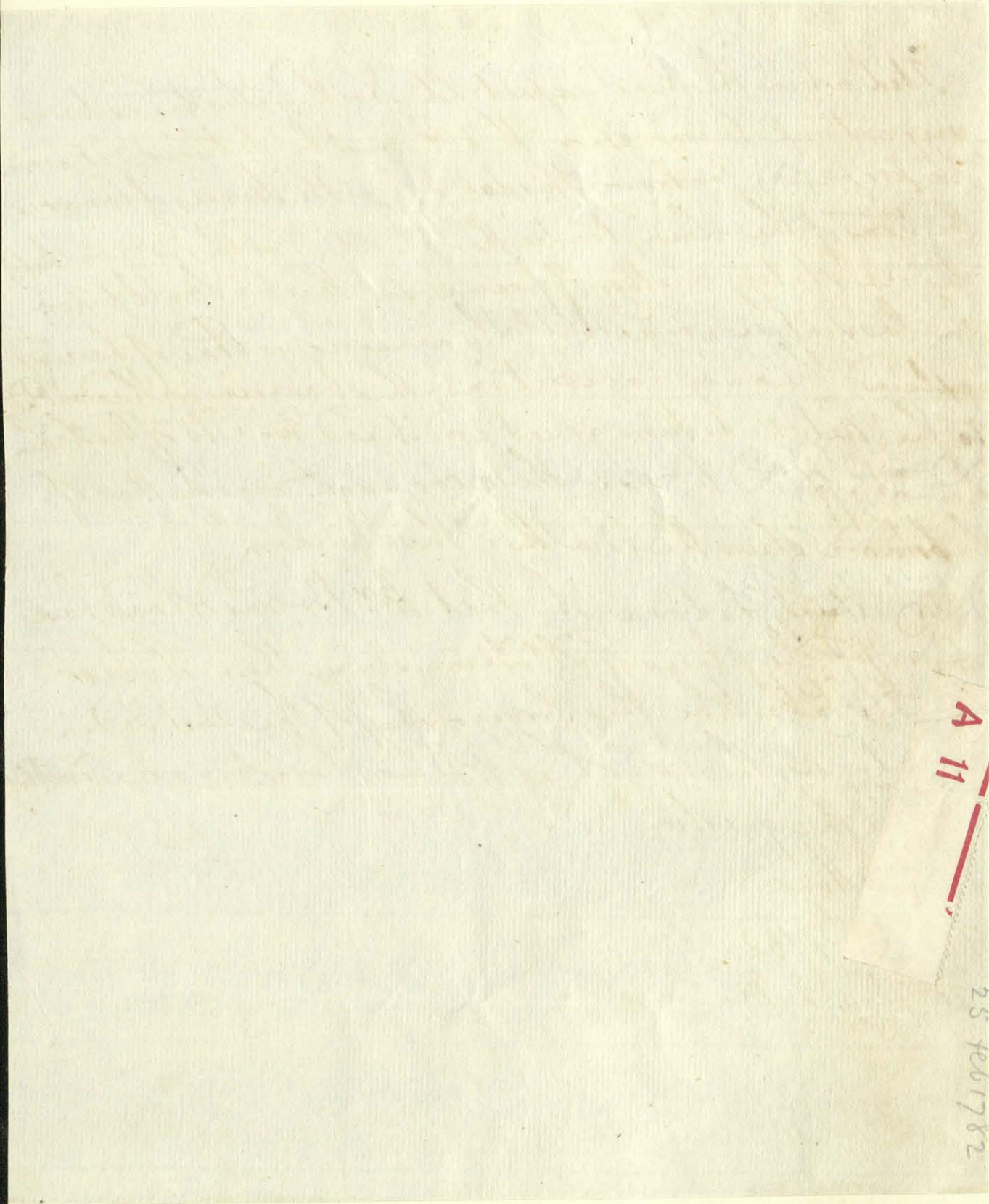
I did not in the least expect Ld. North yesterday as it was very natural to conjecture that he must be detained at home in preparing for laying this day before the House of Commons the terms of the Loan, besides though Ld. North is remarkably clear in stating matters of finance, yet the two small papers he has sent me are undoubtedly an easier method of having explained than any conversation; the bargain is undoubtedly to the Nation to him great credit and two sets of Gentlemen having offered to raise the 13,500,000 equally Men of Substance shew the Wealth of the Kingdom.

I certainly had no wish that Mr. Boman should have more of the place of Sr. Demainway than the best what I take to be the Surveyorship of the East India Warehouses; the two other Offices therefore are undoubtedly out of the question.
