Lord North cannot be surpris'd at my being much hurt at
the Succession of Mr. Conway's motion, though in some
degree prepar'd by what he said Yesterday, an answer
must be given when the House of Commons bring it up,
it is highly delicate to find any words not liable to the
greatest Objections; Lord North will therefore certainly
wish to have the opinion of all the Ministers on the
wording of it. Wherefore the ~~House~~ ^{House} cannot be received till
tomorrow.
I am mortified Lord North thinks he cannot now remain
in Office, I hope I shall see him after the Drawing
Room that I may explain my mind to him
