His Majesty therefore desires
the advice and aid of the
House of Commons as to the
proposed mode of discharging
that debt, and preventing the
like in future without laying
any new burthens on his
People, whom it is his wish
as much as possible to relieve.
For these purposes his Majesty
lays before the House the
plan of reform, which he
has judged proper to make
in his establishment, to be
perfected by the wisdom of
Parliament, leaving it to
their prudence to apply the
savings, that shall be thereby
made to the objects before

mentioned and to such others
as the House may think
most expedient for the honor
of the Crown & the public
benefit. —
