The House of Lords sat till half hour past eight upon the second Reading of the Crick-lade Bill - The House was there for a considerable time not having been summoned by the Treasury - The Debate turned on one side, considering the Bill as a Bill of Pains and Penalties - On the other side It was considered as a

mere Bill of Regulation - Nothing Political
pass'd except that the Duke of Richmond
wished to pin Lord Shelburne to his Pro-
-fessions of desiring a Parliamentary
Reform, no particular detail of which
however was enter'd into.
