Lord Keppel has the honour to transmit to your Majesty
dispatches of the 20th of April from Sir George Rodney, & of 4th 22nd
of April from Sir James Wallace off Martinique, giving an account
of an action under the detached command of Sir Samuel Hood
& the surrender of two more french Ships of the line & a frigate,
which dispatches are brought home by Captain Courtney of the
Euclid, who informs, that one of the french Ships, was the
1st Esprit of 80 guns, the other had several marks aboard

for the Ships at St Domingue. The french Ships of War Surrendered
to the Valiant & Invincible after an Action of about half an hour.
Lord Kippel also has the honour to send to your Majesty Letters
from Lord Muldham in Hamoze. Rear Admiral Sempersfelt. and
from Captain Pole. after his looking into Serrad.
