Then a Motion was made to  
congratulate your Majesty on

instance ——— to which were  
added some other words; which  
seemed to have reference to the  
observations, which were made on  
the seal, and to the advice  
about Honours. These as tending  
to interfere with a matter in  
your Majesty's pleasure were  
left out.

Lord Shelburne has been seized  
with the prevailing disorder of  
a cough and fevers, which so  
many people are disabled with;  
and desired me to send your  
Majesty an account of the  
proceedings. I am afraid it is  
not so perfect, as he would have
