The Prince of Wales having through the Earl of Nova professed that the Education & care of the Person of His Daughter shall be placed under the immediate inspection of the King, His Majesty is willing to take that charge on Himself, & that no unnecessary time may be lost in bringing this to effect, the King has prepared an House at Windsor for the reception of the Princess Charlotte —

Whatever sum has been admitted by the Commissioners named by Parliament for liquidating the Debt of the Prince of Wales, & repaying the Public, for the Maintenance & Education of the young Prince must be in future paid into the hands of the person who shall be named by the King to defray these Expenses, & such additional Charges as may arise by the change of Establishment, must be defrayed by the King —

His Majesty proposes to name a Bishop to superintend Princess Charlotte's Education as it cannot be done that of a female, but she being the Presumptive Heir of the Crown must have one of a more extended nature —

The Bishop is to fix on a proper Clergyman to instruct the young Prince in Religion, & Latin, & daily to read Prayers —

Another Instructor is proposed for History, Geography, belles Lettres & French, History, Music & Dancing Master, ~~and a School~~.

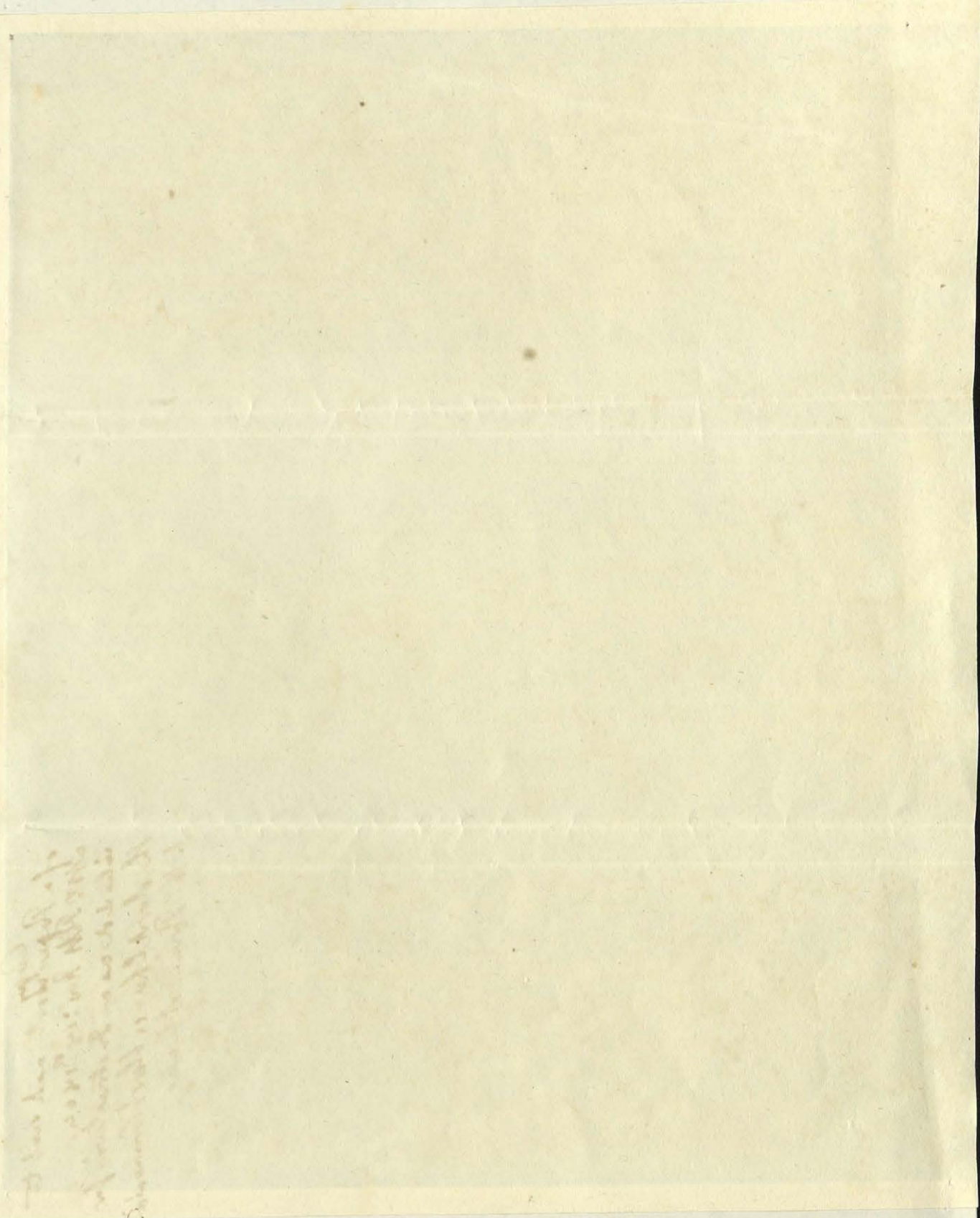
