 The Prince of Wales having through the Earl of Arundel proposed that the Education of His Daughter should be under the peculiar inspection of the King; it is now time to put this into effect. — It seems natural that the Sum allowed to the Prince of Wales for the Maintenance and Education should be paid into the hands of the person to manage Her Expenses, and that any additional that may arise should be defrayed by the King.

His Majesty proposes that a Bishop shall under His peculiar inspection have the Superintendance of the Education of the Young Princess; that He shall prepare a plan for that purpose; that He shall recommend a Clergyman to instruct Her in Religion and Latin; that she shall have an Instructor in History, Geography, Book keeping and French, and a Writing, Drawing and Musick Master.

As to the care of Her Person and constant Behaviour a Governess whose age and activity may be more suited to the care of the Princess than the Countess of Edgim; a Sub Governess and an Assistant Sub Governess, that a female of trust may wait upon Her at her lessons as well as during the rest of the day, and one of the two best <sup>Sheep at Highgate</sup> in Her Room.
