The said Chancellor, with every Sentiment of Respect and
Duty, acknowledges the Receipt of His Royal Highness
The Prince of Wales's Letter of the 24th instant.

With the same Sentiments he begs to express his Hope
that His Royal Highness will allow him to mention,
as he doubts from his Royal Highness's Letter whether
he is sufficiently aware of the Fact, that the Paper,
which he had the Honour to transmit to His Royal
Highness, was delivered to The Chancellor by The King
himself, with His Majesty's express Commands that he should
communicate it to His Royal Highness. Having mentioned
this Circumstance, he very humbly solicits that His Royal
Highness would be graciously pleased to inform him whether
he is to acquaint his Majesty that his Royal Highness
has returned the Paper to the Chancellor, desiring that

all Communications upon this Subject should pass through
the Earl of Moira, who, as the Chancellor understands, is, at
present, in Scotland.

The Lord Chancellor further humbly informs His Royal
Highness that he has communicated the letter he has received
to Mr Pitt, expressing His Royal Highness's Pleasure that Mr
Pitt and the Chancellor should explain to His Majesty what
the Earl of Moira had been authorised to state to them upon
this Subject. The Lord Chancellor can only, most respectfully &
dutifully, assure His Royal Highness that, according to His
understanding of what Lord Moira has been pleased to commu-
nicate to him, he has nothing to add to what he has
already stated to His Majesty; and that, according to that
understanding, the Lord Chancellor is not aware that any
part of what His Majesty states in the Paper transmitted,
as proposed by him, is inconsistent with what the Chancellor
had learnt from the Earl of Moira.
