To meet what has passed on that Subject, the Appointment
of Governors &c, the King proposes, as you will observe
in the Paper, to which I refer your Lordship, to state the
Names for the Prince's Consideration, & that the things chosen
for the Prince's entire Concomitance should go together.

If the paper appears to be that, which it has been
intended to be, I take it for granted that your Lordship
will feel that some answer should be made to it, and that
time ought not to be lost. I have informed the Prince
that I had sent you a Copy, feeling it to be His Royal
Highness's wish to communicate thro' of Lordship.
