The Lord Chancellor offers his most humble
Duty to your Majesty, and takes leave to
send to your Majesty the enclosed Letter,
which he had the Honour to receive from His
Royal Highness The Prince last Night.

He has taken the liberty to show it to
Mr Pitt; and, though they think that the
Phrase, in one or two parts of it, is open
to some Observation, they do not think
that it leaves any Difficulty, upon the
Plan your Majesty has laid down, in
proceeding

proceeding, on your Majesty's part, to nominate
such Persons, as may appear to your Majesty
proper to fill the important Situations, mentioned in the
in your Majesty's first Paper. When your
Majesty shall be graciously pleas'd to communi-
cate their Names to the Prince, the Communi-
cation may be made, as Mr Pitt and The
Duke humbly conceive your Majesty will
be graciously dispos'd to think, in such Terms,
as to obviate any Misunderstanding, if any
could arise from any Expressions, which occur in
this
