The Lord Chancellor, offering his most humble Duty to your Majesty, takes Leave to inclose a Paper, which he yesterday received from His Royal Highness The Prince, dated on the preceding Day - The Prince seems to have thought it more delicate to communicate his Sentiments thro' Lord Mordaunt's Conversation with the Lord Chancellor, than to state upon Paper those Sentiments. They relate to that Article in your Majesty's Paper, which proposed, in a very important Situation, the Name of a Person, to whom the Lord Chancellor had the Honour of mentioning to your Majesty a few days ago he had some Reason to think His Prince might feel an Inclination to object. this Subject with Lord Haubersburg and Mr Pitt, the  
Names of Lady Exeter, & Lady Downshire have  
occurred to them. The Earl of Maria in Conversation  
with the Lord Chamberlain mentioned the Name of  
Lady De Clifford as a Person acceptable to the Service,  
with her Character the Lord Chamberlain is wholly  
acquainted.
