His Majesty, next to doing his Duty, has nothing more at Heart than that the Arrangements for the due Care of the Person and Education of his dear Grand Daughter, The Princess Charlotte, should be settled to the Satisfaction of all Parties, of which he will give the fullest Proof, as he finds the Prince of Wales doubts the Idea of the Sisters of The Barons House, whom the King would most undoubtedly have named as Governess, if the Appointment had respected one of his own Daughters.
