Sir,

I do myself the honor of reporting to Your Majesty my having executed this day the whole of the commands with which you were pleased to intrust me in the letter I received last night. In the first place I called upon Mr Campbell in Burlington Street, and conversed to her in the best manner I was capable of all your Majesty directed me to say upon the subject of her having accepted of Your nomination to the Post of Subgoverness to Princess Charlotte, which seemed to affect her deeply, so much so indeed that she declared herself utterly incapable of finding words adequate to convey all she felt on the occasion. I then proceeded to Lady de Clifford, where my carriage took Mr Campbell, whom I introduced, agreeable to my instructions.



-tions, to her Ladyship. The interview passed off with  
great good humour, and previous to Mr Campbell retiring  
I mentioned to Lady de Clifford, that she would receive  
directions to bring her on Thursday with Prince Charles  
at the hour the Queen would appoint, to the Queen's House  
I had, before that, privately intimated that the young  
Prince would, on Saturday, remove to Windsor.

Having thus carried Your commands  
into effect, I have only to subscribe myself, with the
