The King has not thought it necessary, previous to his Return to Windsor, to take any further Steps for fixing the Residence of his Grand Daughter, as the Apartment is not yet entirely prepared for her Reception. - It has been his Majesty's ^{earnest} wish from the beginning, not to exercise the Right of superintending and directing her Education, otherwise than in entire Concurrence with the Wishes of her Father; and he acted in full Conformity to this Principle in directing a proper Place to be prepared at Windsor for her Residence, except at such times as she might occasionally visit either of her Parents.

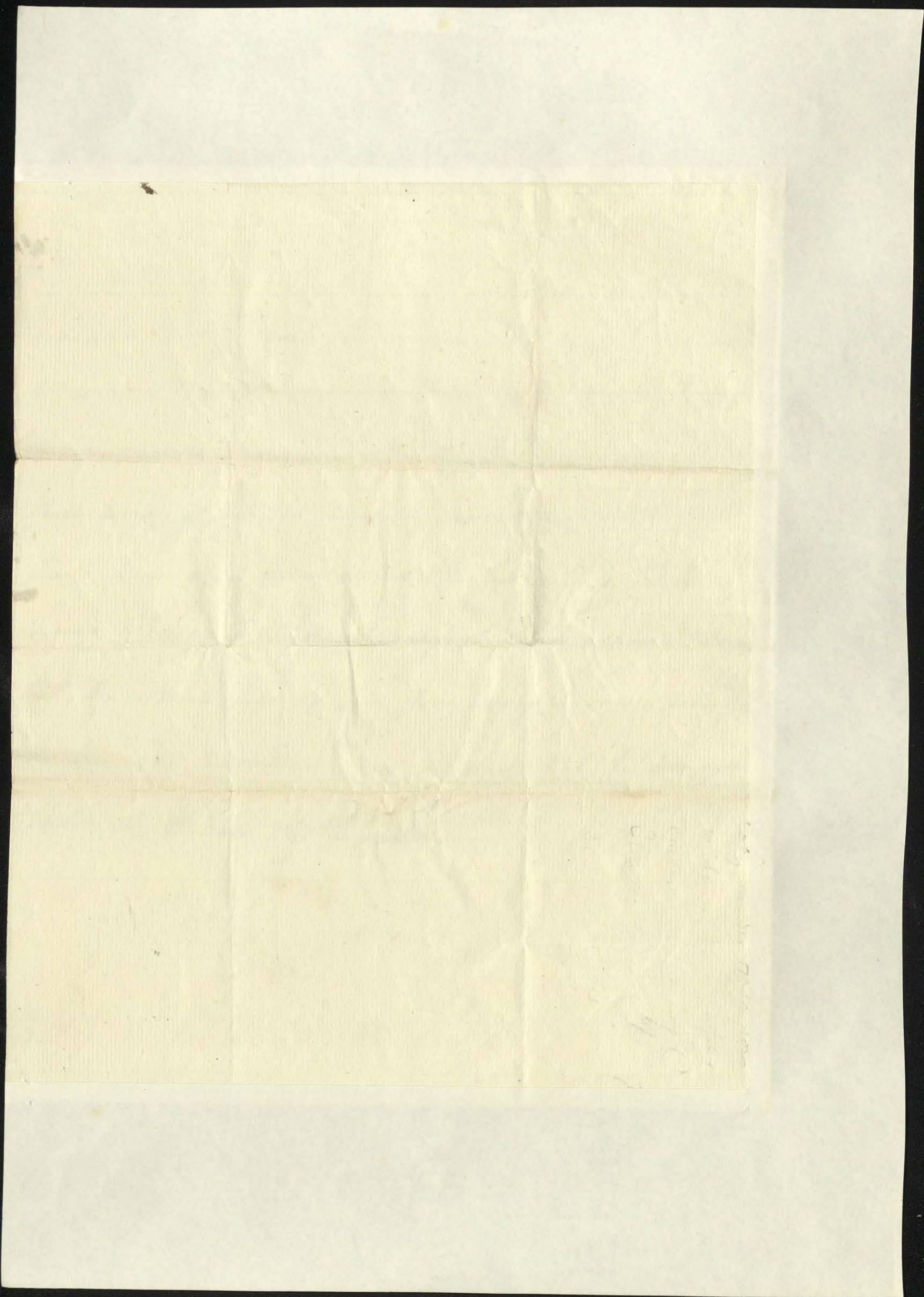
Having since learnt, that the Prince is desirous that she should remain under his Roof during the Time of his usual Residence in Town, and that

She should remain with His Majesty (except during the Term of
occasional Visits) in the Summer, His Majesty is desirous
to concur in that Proposal, and therefore fixes the period of Her
Residence at Windsor from June to January, allowing that She
shall reside at Carlton House the remaining Months of the
Year; from which Arrangement, His Majesty would by no
Means be inclined to depart, unless it should appear to Him,
that Her Absence from His own Roof, during so long a period of
the Year, was calculated to prove detrimental to the Arrangements
made for Her Care and Education. —
