The Lord Chancellor, offering his most humble Duty to your Majesty, has the Honour to represent that he has met Mr Pitt repeatedly upon the Subject, to which the enclosed refer. They take the Liberty to submit to your Majesty's gracious Consideration some few verbal Alterations, which, if your Majesty is pleased to admit them, they humbly think might be usefully made in the Paper, which the Lord Chancellor had the Honour to receive at St James's. In proposing them, they have been actuated by reflecting that your Majesty's gracious Purpose has uniformly been to sacrifice, to the great Object of actually securing the Prince's good Education, as that could, consistently with Principle, be less anxiously attended to. It also

seems to be extremely desirable to use throughout such
Exposures as, on the one hand, fairly consider, fully assert
your Majesty's Rights, and, on the other, leave no Pretence
to those, if any such there are, who may be disposed to
advise the postponing of a final Settlement of this important
Subject, to suggest further Correspondence, not upon the
Substance of what is proposed, but upon the words in
which a proposition is made.

They now humbly submit your Majesty's enclosed
Paper, & another, containing the Alterations alluded to,
to your Majesty's wisdom.

Our Lord Chancellor put into Mr Pitt's Hands the
other Papers relative to the Expenses of The Princess's Edu-
cation & he has had a satisfactory Conversation with him
on the matter which interests The Bishop of Exeter.
