The King has not thought it necessary, previous  
to his Return to Windsor, to take any further  
Steps for fixing the Residence of his Grand Daughter,  
as the Apartment is not yet entirely ready for  
her Reception. It has been his Majesty's  
earnest wish from the Beginning, in superin-  
tending and directing her Education, to act  
in entire concurrence with the wishes of  
her Father, and it was in full conformity  
to this principle that he directed a proper  
Plan to be prepared at Windsor for her  
Residence <sup>except</sup> at such Times as she might  
occasionally

occasionally visit either of her Parents

Having since learnt that the Prince  
is desirous that she should remain under  
his Roof during the time of his usual  
Residence in Town, & that she should remain  
with his Majesty in the Summer (except  
during the time of occasional Visits) His  
Majesty is disposed to concur in that  
Proposal, and is desirous to fix the  
Period of her Residence at Windsor from  
June to January, & is willing that she  
shall reside at Carlton House the remaining  
Months of the Year: and His Majesty would

not be desirous of making any Alteration in this  
Arrangement, which admits the absence of the Princes  
for so large a part of the Year from his own Court,  
unless it should appear to him to become Detrimen-  
tial to the Execution of the Plan proposed for  
the Education of the Princes, in which His Majesty  
can never cease to take the strongest Interest,  
both from personal Affection, & from what he  
feels to be due to the future Welfare of His  
Subjects.
