My dear Mr. Borthwick

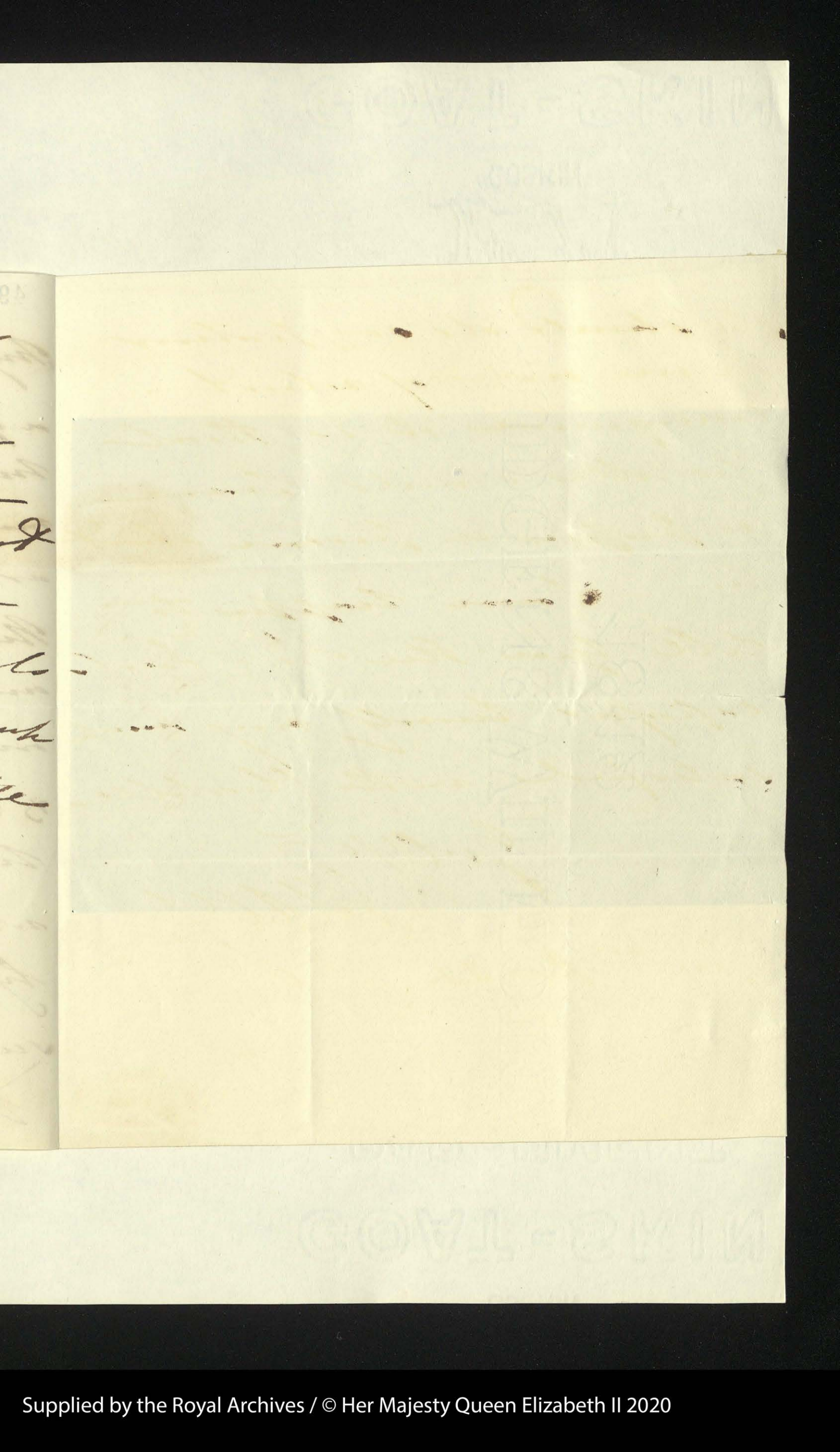
The King has passed
