My dear Charlotte

I cannot resist a few lines, as I hear to my extreme regret that you are ill of one of your usual bad colds & coughs, & I should be sorry if you thought I forget my old friends easily, tho' buried in solitude & by no means well, tho' better

I am glad to be able to tell you, that you have a very good friend in Lady Ashbrook, who I know well & is near me here — we have often talked of you & she intends to pay you a visit as soon as she comes to Town, & is very anxious for the success of the Print — I hope to get a few more Names here to add to the list — And, now, I wish you would print me an Eye of myself, the small size, & let me have it as soon as you can, only pray let it be darker & a more marked eyebrow, as that is the remark made here as being wanted —

I fancy I shall be in London to settle about the 9th or 10th of next Month & I wish much to have

The Cup before them to give to a lady who is very anxious for it here — I have had a letter from M^{rs} Henry, who writes quite cheerfully & in good spirits, but I have not heard from lady Del-

I hope really to see you much better, for believe me, I shall be very glad to see you again & that, as soon as ever I come to Town, as I always feel desirous for every good attending you —

The cold is come on here exceedingly severe & as you know I dislike cold weather I feel it extremely, but all feel it in the neighbourhood it is so very sharp —
