Sir

I have the honour to send your Ma-
jesty the Letters, which I have this
moment receiv'd from Jarris - Consi-
dering the very explicit Terms, in which
Monsieur de Rayneval expresses him-
self, and the confidence undoubt-
-ly due to that Gentleman, as well
as that which the Court of France
appears to have taken in your

to summon without delay a cabinet,
that we may come to a provisional
agreement with them, and that
their assistance may be obtained
in settling with Spain, and the
whole if possible brought together
before Parliament.

I will in the mean time make
a private Enquiry concerning the
manner of putting off Parliament
in case of necessity, and will take
the liberty of recommending gene-
ral Secrecy to my colleagues, which
if it can be now observ'd, as well

as it has been in the progress of
the Treaty hitherto must do Infinite
credit to Your Majesty's Govern-
ment.
