In examining my papers
and reading over the copies of my letters
to you before I wrote my last letter
to the Prince Regent - being anxious to state
letters to state only what I could prove
I examined the contents of the packet
of papers which by your desire I wrote
to Mr McMahon - to tell you you
had left for me in a drawer at Boston
House - - and which by your desire I
sent to me - on looking over the packet
I find more than I think you intended
to send me - for in your hand writing
there are minutes of conversation between
you and the Prince Regent before he had
signed his Evidence - letters from you to
Mr Toulblanc - and ~~all~~ my letters

to you - all I asked for was the
 Minute of such parts of Lord Berkeley's
 Confession to the Prince Regent, which
I received from his Grace Hyndes
 and which for some reason or other was
 not in the Testimony given to me bearing
 his signature and therefore is not in the hand of
 the said Chancellor - I remain Dear Sir

Regent to know the substance of my letter.
I sent Mr Adam a copy of the last letter
to his Major Mynors - I thought it was
due to him that I should do so his name
being so often mention'd in it - I likewise
wrote to Mr Adam on the 3rd of July
the contents of my letter I thought he would
feel bound to say before the Prince Regent
and if I find he does not I shall send it
to him myself - God bless you
