Sir,

I had the honor the other day of receiving a letter from Your Majesty of the 4th of this Month by which I find both You, and the Queen are well, which gives me very great pleasure. I mean to leave ^{this} place next Thursday the 27, to go again by the way of Lubek, but instead of going by Harbourg, I take the rout of Lunebourg to avoid staying any time at Hambourg. As to naming exactly what time I shall be in England is rather difficult, but I hope from the 6th to the 12th of September to be able to pay my Duty to You Sir at Richmond. The Queen is very Well but I think she is too much hurried for we are cut from Morning to ^{night} either parties into the Country, or Reviews. I shall be better

able to give You an account Sir, of
the troops when we meet than I can possibly
at present. We were yesterday at Elsinor
which is certainly very well worth seeing, there
was a regiment reviewed there which seems
to be one of the best. I have spent two or
three mornings in the Yards, and Decks,
and I must say they are in as good order
as they possibly can be in. I have also been
on board most of their ships. Tomorrow is
the Queens birthday, which is to be celebrated
for three days. I expect by the next post a letter
from Brunswick, I intend being particularly
cautious with my Sister for I think I have
some reason to be so.
