Sir,

I take the Opportunity of Dr Duval's return to England to express to your Majesty the Sense I have of your goodness to me, in having received Mr Vincent so graciously. He has inform'd ^{me} of ^{the} kind manner you nam'd me, and in a late letter he flatters me that your Majesty will point out a proper Person to be about my Daughter, and that you have no objection to my sending my Son to a University: all which gives me the greatest satisfaction, as your Approbation is what I always wish to merit.

I have directed Dr Duval to inform Lord Sidney of a foolish affair that happened lately to four Young English here; and the Steps I took to put a stop to any unpleasant consequences. He is able to answer any questions upon this Subject, as he

was present all the time. I had an outward
Visit the other day from the Prince of Wirtemberg
who is lately separated from the Dutchess of Brunsw^{ick}
Daughter; I find the two youngest Princes of
Brunswicks are coming to Lausanne, which
surprises me as they will often meet the
P. of Wirtemberg there.
