Dear Sir,

I desired the Duke of Cumberland to make  
my excuses to you for not having been at Windsor  
these last days, having had a return of the asthma  
from the great cold of Saturday night. I have  
had my baggage ready at the door to day,  
but really find myself not well enough to  
come, as I am not essentially called up ~~on~~: if  
I can I will be at Windsor by 1/2 p. 12<sup>o</sup> clock  
tomorrow. The accounts from Windsor differ  
much, I think they should not. I have continued  
to write to my sister, without giving her any  
flattering hopes, as to the main complaint.
