The House in a Committee on the Malt Bill went through the same with Amendments which are to be reported on Monday —

Sir Joseph Mansbey reported the Amendments to the Bill to allow the Importation of Oats which were agreed to and with the Bill ordered to be engrossed

The Bill to prohibit the Exportation of Corn read the 3<sup>d</sup> Time and passed

The Bill to allow the Importation of Iron from America read the 3<sup>d</sup> Time and passed

The House in a Committee on the papers presented by Mr. Secretary Conway relating to America

Question proposed that the House be moved that a humble Address be presented to his Majesty in consequence of the Resolutions of Wednesday last to Express the Indignation and Concern of the House at the dangerous Tumults and Insurrections which have been raised in several of the Colonies in North America, whereby the Execution of a British Act of Parliament has been actually defeated the Powers and dignity of his Majesty's Government set at defiance and the legal Constitutional Dependence of the said Colonies on Great Britain impaired and Violated to Express their entire Confidence in his Majesty's Royal Wisdom and firmness that he will give effectual Orders and

take all proper Measures for preventing any  
Attempts of the like Dangerous Nature for the  
future and for carrying into Execution all Laws  
and Statutes relating to the said Colonies and  
Plantations enacted by the Supreme Legislature  
of these Kingdoms <sup>To recognize</sup> his Majesty's protection and  
Favour His loyal and dutiful Subjects in North  
America who have manifested their Desire to  
comply with and assist in the Execution of the Act  
passed in the last Session of Parliament for imposing  
certain Duties by Stamps in the said Colonies and  
with the other Statutes of the Realm and to assure  
his Majesty that this House will firmly and steadily  
Support his Majesty in all such Measures as  
shall be necessary for vindicating the just Rights  
of Parliament for enforcing the Obedience due to  
the Law from all his Majesty's Subjects in every  
part of his Dominions and for restoring Order and  
tranquility to the Colonies
