the Service of his Ma^{ty} Household Family and other his -
necessary Expenses and Occasions -

pa. 307. - It is provided that if the Civil List Revenues together with
the Additional 120000 should from Michas 1715 produce in
Clear money more than 700000 £ Annum The Overplus
should go and be part of the said Aggregate Fund and be -
Applied with the said Fund to the Cancelling and Discharging
Exchequer Bills and after the Discharging thereof the -
Overplus exceeding 700000 is not to be issued and applied
to any Use whatsoever without the Authority of Parliament
And all Grants and Dispositions of such Overplus without
Authority of Parliament are void and the Grantees judged
uncapable in Law to take or enjoy the Same
