Resolved that if the Revenues Settled by the Act of the first Year of his Mat<sup>y</sup> Reign (Entituled An Act for the better Support of his Mat<sup>y</sup> Household and of the Honour and Dignity of the Crown of Great Britain) together with the said Additional Revenue of 120000 £ shall produce more in Clear Money than the yearly Sum of 700000 £ to be reckoned from Michas 1715 then the Overplus of such Produce be made part of the General Fund to be Established as aforesaid and be appropriated issued and applied accordingly until all the Exchequer Bills shall be paid off or the said General Fund shall be redeemed by Parliament: and that afterwards such Overplus exceeding 700000 £ shall be not issued granted disposed or applied to any Use or purpose or upon any pretext whatsoever without Authority of Parliament

Mr. Farrer presented to the House (according to Order) a Bill for enlarging the Fund for the Governor & Company of the Bank of England relating to Excheq. Bills, and for settling an Additional Revenue of 120000 £ and upon his Mat<sup>y</sup> during his life for the Service of the Civil Government: and for Establishing a certain Fund of 54600 £ in Order to raise a Sum not exceeding 910000 £ for the Service of the Publick by Sale of Annuities after the rate of 6 % Cent £ and redeemable by Parliament
