use) was the produce of the Civil List Revenue

29 July 1715 Mr. Farror presented to the House (according to Order)
a Bill for enlarging the Fond for the Governor & Company
of the Bank of England relating to Excheq. Bills, and
for settling an Additional Revenue of 120000 £
and upon his Ma^t during his life for the Service of
the Civil Governm^t: and for Establishing a certain Fond
of 54600 £ and in Order to raise a sum not exceeding
910000 £ for the Service of the Publique by Sale of
Annuitie^s after the rate of 6 pCent £ and redeemable
by Parliament
