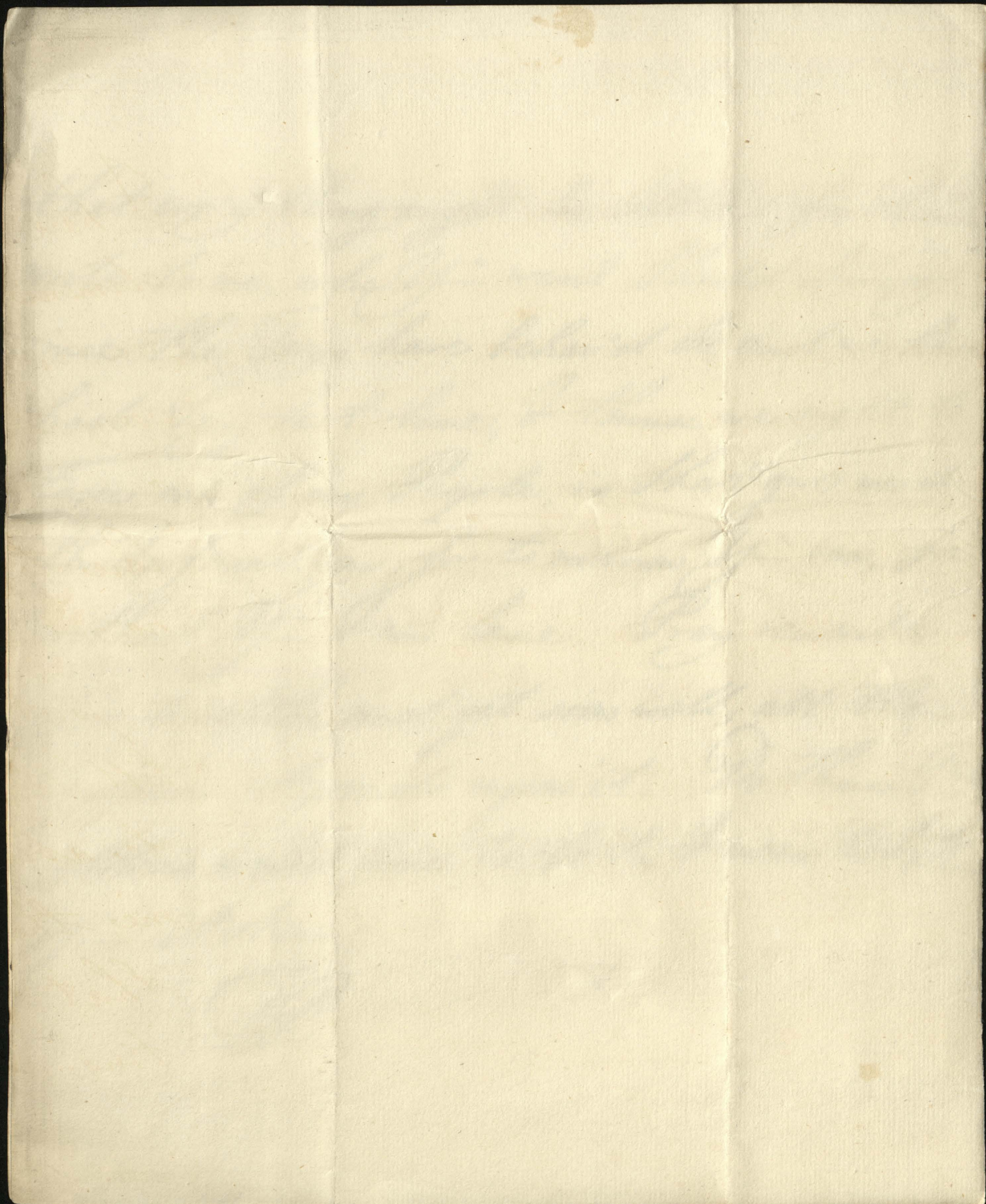
that every thing might be settled for Thursday

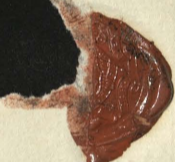
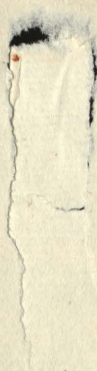

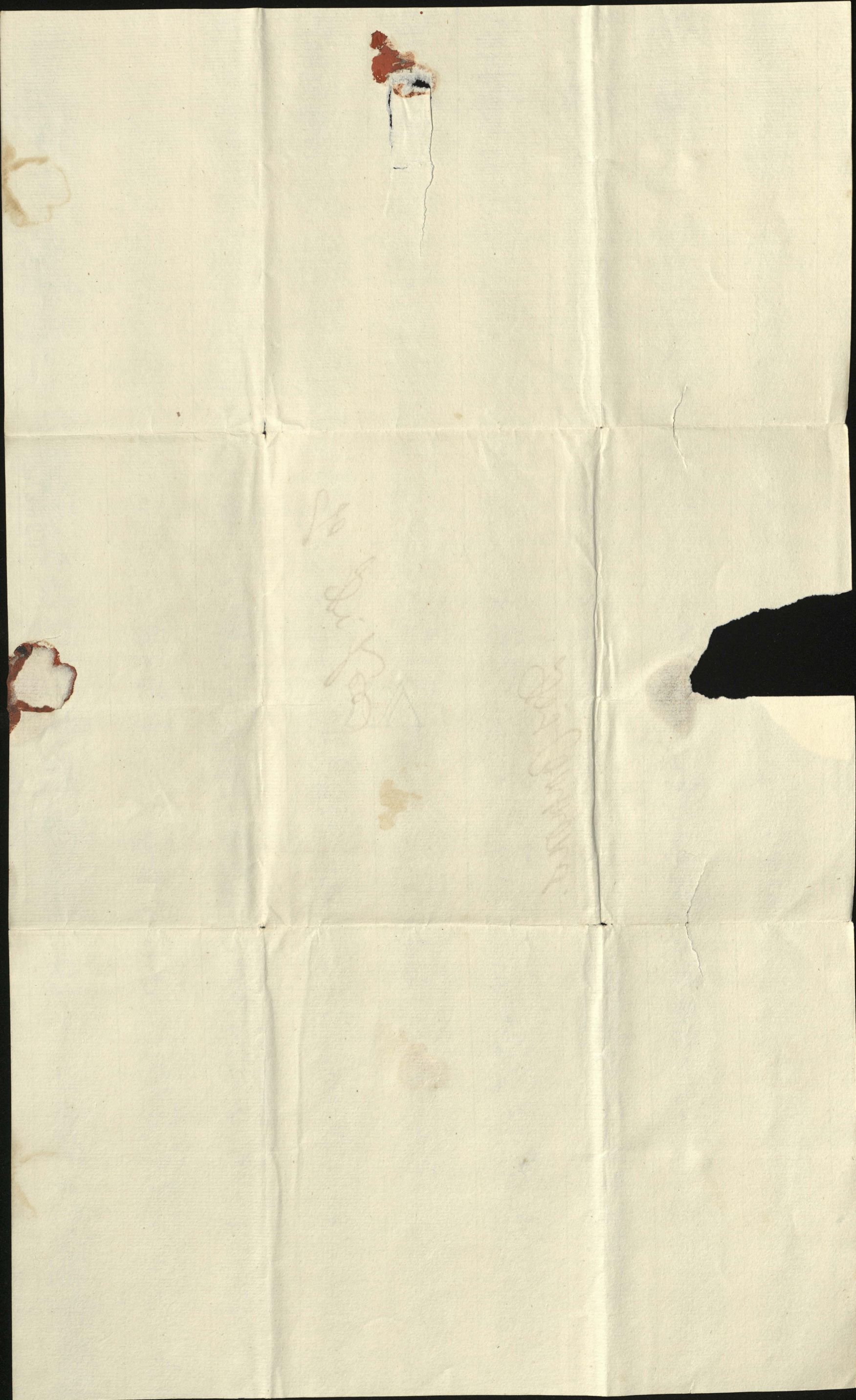
