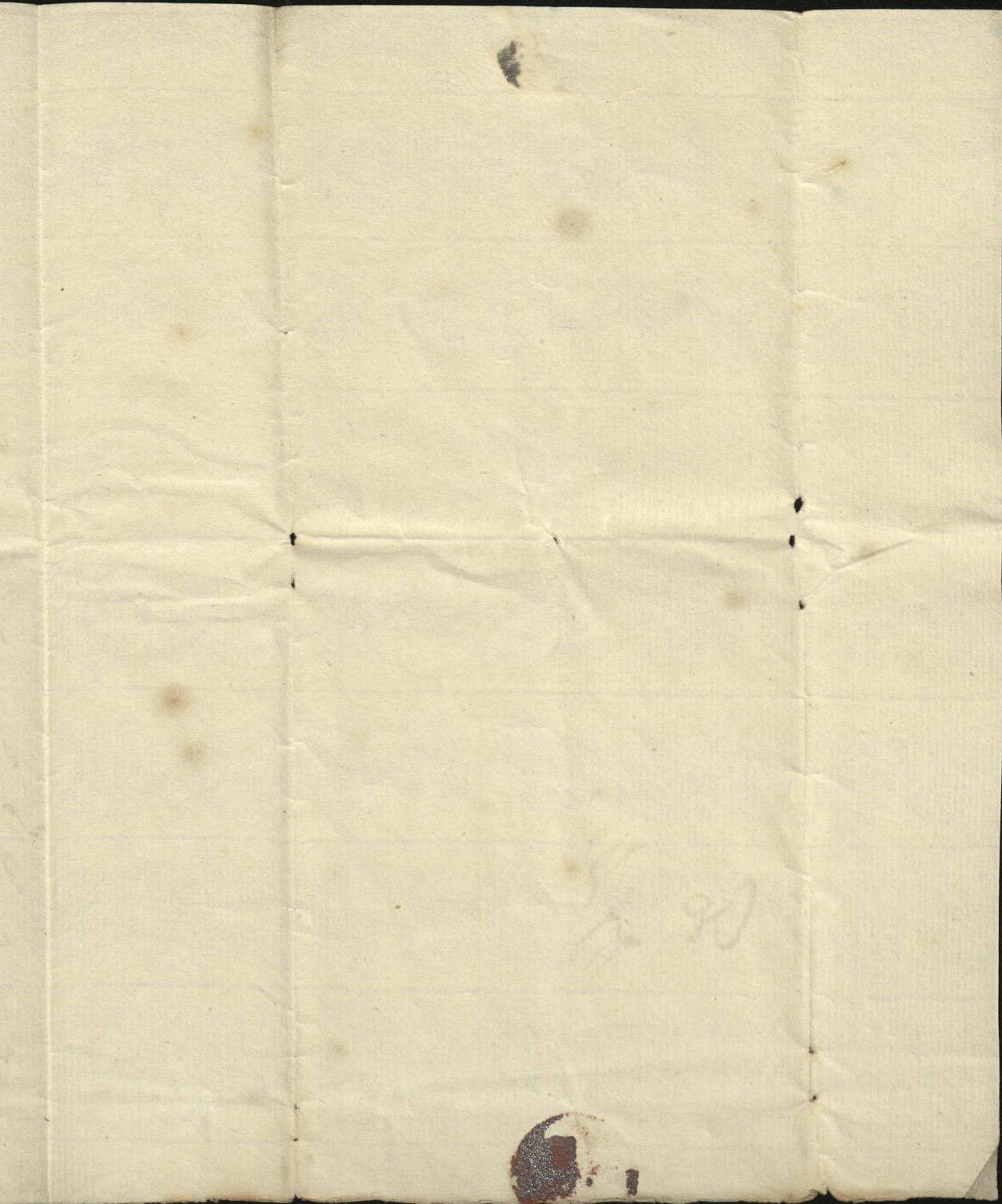
Sir
