Sir

Her Royal Highness having delivered me
 the enclosed in order to form a Warrant for
 a Commission for Her Servants to meet upon this
 Model & another that is in the Books of
 Her Late Royal Highness, The Prince & Princess
 Ann of Denmark, I chose first to ~~let~~ send you
 the enclosed, If you would direct a form you ap-
 proved of, Her Royal Highness The Princess Dudge,
 proper that your self, Her Vice Chamberlain
 Commissioner for the Horse, Secretary, Auditor Genl.
 Attorney, & Solicitor General should be Commissioners,
 or any three or more to make a Board; And
 if you will be so good, as to send me the form of
 such a Commission, my Clerk shall transcribe it,
 & I will immediately present it to Her Royal

Highness for Her signature. As the home now seems
very ~~near~~ ^{near} when W.A.M. may be confided, I am
commanded to desire you that this may be settled
as soon as possible, as it is W.A.M. intention that the
Commissioners may meet soon, & continue to do ^{so} at least
once ^{by} month, or oftner as need may require. The
Persons in G.P.M. are the Prince & Princess of Denmark
Family (which was a very small one comparatively
to Her R.M. the Prince of Wales & the Duchess)
consisted only of Mr. Benjamin Ba Shurt the Treasurer
The Master of the Horse ^{his} Secretary Mr. Philip Lloyd
His Comptroller, The late Queen Caroline had such
a Commission, but I have not (tho I have many of
the books relating to the Government of the Household)
The Copy of that Commission. So that I beg you will
give me your opinion how it shall be drawn up.
There are many expenses & extraordinary ones new to
be considered, I believe Mr. Am. only shewed you pretty

high contingencies which must arise from the necessity
 keeping the Houses in repair; Her Royal Highness told
 me this morning, she desired the Houses might be
 examined, & only such expences made as were most
 necessary, & those to be done out of hand, as the neglect
 of such repairs as required immediate consideration,
 would produce greater expences soon unavoidably.
 But as to how she thought that might remain
 something longer, I hope you will see W. A. soon & receive
 Her directions upon this Subject, because I apprehend
 that Her home is now very near, & that it is not talked
 of in the House, I have heard that last night Mrs
 Cannon sat up, & that there was reason to believe
 every day it may be expected that W. A. may be
 delivered. W. A. appeared very well this morning,
 & as it did not become me to ask any Questions,
 I was glad to see W. A. appear so very well, & calm,
 after last night's alarm for there was one as I have
 been told. God Bless we Her. I send this by one of your
 messengers, I must soon get one to my office, for
 I find my self often under difficulties for want of one.
