Sir

I was obliged to Leave Leicester House yesterday before you came from the Princess and therefore give you this Trouble to begg the Favour of you to let me know Her Royal Highness's Commands about the Venison Warrants that I may acquaint the Coffener with Them.

Since I shew'd you the Account I had drawn up of the Household Expence I have made some Additions to it stated the Expence of the Nursery and put all the Articles which were formerly brought into other Accounts in one View from whence Her Royal Highness will see that if the present Calculation is not exceeded The Expence will be less than it was in the Year 1737. If you think it proper that I should shew this Account to the Princess I will begg the Favour of you to make my Duty to Her Royal Highness and acquaint Her I have it ready whenever it would be agreeable to Her Royal Highness to see it.
