I have Received the whole 15000². for the Princesses Annuities this October Quarter, Sir William Jiby before he left the Town, signed the Contract with M. Cure, for hire of Additional Goods Served in May 1752. to the amount of 333 by the Items, but reduced by Sir William in the Total Valuation, to a Principal Sum of 300³ for which M. Cure is to have Ten ¹/₁₀ Cent ¹/₁₀ Cent for the Use, from Midsummer 1752. The Apothecaries Bill for Medecines at Kew, which I send herewith has been laid before D^r DuVal, who declared he thought it extravagant & very justly declined certifying it, as he was privy to but a very small part of it, & said he would declare his thoughts upon it to the Princess, the reason I trouble you with it at Kew is that you may inspect it on the spot, and if you think proper there to enquire into the reasonableness of the Charge, the Creditor for September amounting to 926. 7. 4²/₄ is come to my hands, which I will keep till you come to Town to lay before you
