his permission though his is

it merely for the sake of being
fitter & able to sacrifice his master's
wishes, & does not procure any
inconveniencie which can attend
it, the different appartement to which
his majesty has ordered for the
use of the King of Denmark & all
his suite being all prepared.

Lord Herford concur'd with
Mr Dicey yesterday in obedience
to his majesty's commands & the
Baron took upon himself to answer
that the King of Denmark would
not wish to be met by any of the
King's servants upon the Road &
that compliment from his majesty
upon the King of Denmark's arrival
in his appartement, from his chamberlain
would be thought perfectly respectful
