The Duke of Grafton presumes to ask the Kings Commands, whether he should or should not apprise the Bishop of Litchfield & Coventry, that after the Lewis tomorrow, his Majesty means to see that he sits in the Court, after having conferr'd so high & eminent a Trust on his Lordship. He humbly submits this to his Majestys Pleasure, lest the Bishop should have left Sr. Jamess as soon as he has had the honor of kissing the Kings hand.
