The Duke of Grafton thinks it his Duty to  
lose no Time in acquainting his Majesty that  
Capt. Dunant is returned, & presumes to  
inclose the Relation he has deliver'd to him of  
the Occurrences relating to his Commission from  
the Time the King saw the last Letter from M<sup>r</sup>.  
Capt. Dunant wrote from Paoli's own Dictating  
that Part which pass'd at their Interview. This  
Gentleman also pick'd up on his Return thro'  
France repeated Intelligence of a Delay on  
the part of that Crown from sending the further  
Troops that were design'd, & also, that M<sup>r</sup>.  
de Chouvelin was not yet embark'd. The  
Description Capt. Dunant gives of the Climate  
& Nature of the Country, requiring a still of  
War peculiar to itself & to its Inhabitants, join'd  
to the eager zeal of the Corsicans incited by the  
Difficulties & constant State of Danger they have  
to live in, & bear with cheerfulness, makes the success  
of the French very doubtful; & that, which some

if it should not totally defeat their Purpose.
