A little previous to His Majesty's going to bed last night He spoke, more than we have lately heard Him to do, of his own situation, of his confinement, of his taking no exercise, and some other particulars, which might have been consider'd as indications of a natural state of mind, had they not been combined with palpable delusions. The whole was in a perfectly gentle tone and manner.
