Weymouth Sep<sup>r</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> 1798

How kind and good of You My dear Dearest Brother to have written so such delightfull accounts of our Emely It was as like Your feeling and affectionate Heart and has not been unworthily received here - What a pleasant happy time we spent during the last six Weeks, and how much was added to by the seeing so much of You - I am quite of the same Opinion of the old French Song - "On sent en la maison qu'on sein de sa famille" but then it must be such a one as mine with a G<sup>d</sup> like You -

I bled myself yesterday My Doctors Order in the warm Bath and tomorrow shall bathe in the Sea.

Our two Battalions of Foot Companies are broken up the Grenadiers and Light Infantry of the Dorset went on Sunday the North Gloucesters the Day before yesterday - and the other go to Coole and the Isle of Wight - the Berkshire Militia will come here in their stead - Sir William Pitt approves very much of Lord Charles Somerset's says that he takes very great pain and will bring the Berkshire Militia very forward by his Midship a Commencement - This place is very full but not of many people we know - My Mother desires this love to You She is in very famous looks - We saw Kemble out Penraddock finely indeed - to night there is to act the Jew of Venice

He is engaged for 5 Nights and we are to see him each time  
My dear Briggs is also here but unfortunately Hughes will  
not engage him which is a great disappointment must to me  
I shall direct this to Carlton House not knowing exactly where  
to find you - Give my Belongs to the Smith when you join  
it and God bless you may ever dear old Brother Love  
near as ever love Yours more Affectionately than G's  
Deeds
