My Dear Ernest

Upon the whole this had been a Wilder  
 Day - though the Physicians say the Delusions and Convulsions  
 were pretty the same as for the last Week - certainly the King's  
 manner was very good & natural with the Queen and myself this Morn-  
 ing but his ideas and Schemes were quite as Extraneous as ever -  
 Doctor Robinson spent in this Evening that except in this manner  
 there was not the smallest Difference, that the Delusion of Manoeuvring  
 was as strong as ever though he had supposed it before this, and that the  
 King was inclined to be very incoherent on going to bed to Night, and had  
 often expressed that he was heart at not having his Legs but he wanted  
 to ask further - He has also invented Speeches for all those he  
 has seen today - and I understand your heart told Doctor Robinson  
 the Convulsion during the walk was chiefly in a white fire but very  
 incorrect indeed - I wish I could send you a better account -
