My Dear Brother

We are all most anxious to hear how you are to day. We were not satisfied with Sir Henry's account of you last night - therefore the Queen sends me to bother you on the hope of having a very particular account either from Sir Walter or Mr. Anson. The Queen asks me to say how you are & is at your undergoing so much pain - and how sincerely she hopes you will soon be able to get out of bed again.

I am very glad you give me a tolerable account of the dear King. He is not so much excited as yesterday but still there has been a great deal of very unpleasant laughing very early this morning, which I fear may increase in the course of the day into the same sort of irritability as we suffered so much from yesterday.
