My dear Papa —  
 Many thanks for your kind  
 letter received yesterday by Dr. P. who  
 who arrived between three & 4 o'clock  
 Andin went out in the Prince of Wales  
 carriage and found it easier than  
 any carriage she has been in since  
 the illness I am ever the better  
 certainly brought in some  
 increase of pain in the side  
 she remained not quite  
 three quarters of an hour and  
 considering how ill she has  
 been since the last time  
 she went out the drive went off

tolerably very faint & low but life  
 fatigued when she came home  
 then I returned to bed —  
 Dr. P. found her full as well  
 as he expected from the account  
 he had received from B. —  
 & gives us hopes we may begin  
 our journey on Sunday —

She was very unwell last night  
 with a complete indigestion  
 caused by something disagreeing  
 with her stomach which she  
 eat at dinner Dr. P. wished  
 her stomach to be relaxed and  
 with  
 suitable much difficulty

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which brought on great pain in  
the side at last it was spotted  
she has had a very independent  
night as the side used to  
have been very much strained  
& fatigued by all that happened  
early in the evening & of course  
her much increased the  
shooting pain in the side  
which prevented all sleep —  
Dr. P. finds her Pulse ~~low~~  
better than he could expect  
this morning considering  
all she suffered last night  
but desired her to remain  
in bed the hot part of the day

Am on the Dr still says he thinks  
we should be able to leave  
Weymouth Friday —
