My dear Papa

We arrived at this place
a quarter before two o'clock
having ^{left} Woodstock at
11 o'clock. I & Papa says all
things considered she
is full as well as he
expected & as he must
be a far better judge
than Lady George and
myself I trust God
this journey may end
as well as possible
I am as the sea
in August —

She has suffered ^{much} with
 with pain in the
 side & constant
 faintings, but the
 rays in about an
 hour we shall be
 able to get on to
 London. She is now
 lying down in
 a very comfortable
 chair in a quiet
 room & appears
 recovering a little
 from all she has

suffered for the last
 few hours. She is
 but a very indolent
 might from fatigue
 & pain of little or
 no sleep but yet is
 determined if she
 cannot get on to
 as far as she could
 in the journey.
 Her fortitude and
 resignation is beyond
 what I can say as
 I get extreme
 me but hardly could

been resolute to
go on as many days
missing suffering
with fever have
a journey
