I have received your kind letter dated from Salisbury, concerning the App. You were forced to make on account of poor Ann's & very great Sufferings on the Road, and, fully impressed as I am with the Extent of what she bears with so much Resolution, I should have been alarmed at the thoughts of your being forced to continue at Salisbury; if I had not, at the same time, learnt your safe removal at Windsor. — I feel more hurt than I can describe, when I consider how truly painful must be the Exertions of so many Successive Hours & days, and poor Ann's Situation is now present to my Thoughts. — I cannot sufficiently admire the Fortitude which she shows, & which, I am convinced can only be produced by a sense of Duty for the Reward of which, in the complete Restoration of her Health, I trust in the powerful Aid of the Almighty.
