Tuesday night  
Left about 10 o'clock  
My dear Papa Amelia has had  
a good deal of pain in her head  
to day but after the effect of  
the medicine she felt  
much relieved - We had  
a visit from Mr Dundas  
whom I am happy to say  
found her better in every  
respect than when he  
saw her Saturday the  
Pulse quiet & less fever  
She got up before 10 o'clock  
& lay on the couch till  
near 10 as the weather  
is so cold Dr Pope desired  
her not to venture

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out into the next room  
 therefore she has not been  
 out of the bed room to day

When Bates came  
 to see her at six o'clock  
 he told me he had  
 not for days found her  
 pulse so quiet, neither  
 has there some degree  
 of fever is come on again  
 which must be expected  
 towards night after a long  
 an illness
