

Sep. 19 [1814]

My dear Mr. Butler I must begin this
letter with informing you that
I received a letter from Dilly this
morning dated the 4th from Bremen
in which he tells me he has
seen Reckel the day before in
his way back to Brunswick from
Pomont where he had been for
a few days - and he told him
"The Poph' had been going on
in a strange way at Brunswick
she had dancing parties every
evening & had been as gay as
Drops she invited all sorts
of people - a young girl con-
- coming whom there is some
old history & whom she took
with her from England she
was married to one of the
Duke's and he comes. This must
all have been arranged in
nine days." - "Pophall comes

was with her at 15 o'clock and
succeeded in getting her - "She talks
of going to Italy but to Greece
first" "She was civil to the
Beckels -" Lady (Lady's name)
at Brunswick until I return
with her when she is to
go with her & the G. (G. name)
to see to attend the meeting

Dolly tells me in her letters

Dolly's writing and I am
