My dear Brother I should have
 written sooner if I had had any
 thing my good to say, but as
 I think you may expect to
 write to know some thing about
 us I take up my pen to give
 you the outlines of our
 journey so that you may
 draw your own conclusions
 We left London as was intended
 on Monday morning of course
 much was said & related
 by turns without fault but
 got to Hertford Bridge four
 better than I expected
 The Sunday Wednesday &
 Thursday which was the
 day we arrived at this
 Place she was dreadfully
 ill indeed stayed to
 rest at every place we
 stopped to change horses
 were there as soon
 at each I need not say
 was tantamounting from

fatigue & violence of the
 fever on the side
 caused by a degree of inflammation
 brought on by the preceding
 Rheumatism which added
 to the dull dull pain in
 the same side, the two
 in long suffered with
 was a very serious
 consideration. The pain on
 the side which started
 the height of the inflammation
 & brought it outwards
 on the side, but the side
 never has been easy since
 & a degree of fever comes
 whenever from fatigue
 never left her yet, instead
 we are completely
stomach back and until
 the bad effects of the preceding

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we got the letter of we could
 be no judge what effect
 this Place among them
 we see, can tell yesterday
 she never has been out
 of the House where she
 was carried into a
 Bathing Machine
 to breathe the Sea Air
 she has a quantity of
 we know in a week
 we continued to follow
 in the Machine & though
 my friends & I got I
 find it rather did
 revive her as she wrote
 a letter since then
 she has done yet since
 we left home & did
 sleep 4 times in the
 night which I hope

and moving more to the
Sea Air. There was
starry clear & dry and
such a good breeze and I
renewed a full hour
with the less fatigue to hand
Therefore I was inclined
to hope we had secured
something in the last
24 hours. The jungle
however has been more
frequent since the
journey and the smaller
draft of air efforts have
scarcely & being more
enough. I hope still
you are every comfort
that all may do well
in time. Beason likewise
stays comfortably but
calls her a Hot House
at

Her fortitude & resignation
 is far beyond what I ever
 do justice to she never
 complains & in the prison
 I suppose you have suffered
 much that it was impossible
 for her sensibly to speak
 yet she did all she could
 to keep up Lady George &
 my spirits by appearing as
 often as she could she
 told letters — nothing ever
 to hinder them Lady George
 her daughters as well
 as I will send a good
 quantity of writing
 but am surprised to find
 of attentions to letters of us
 Every time we hear we
 were thankful that
 the King let us
 come with the Queen
 as I see I am of more

and to see my very nice as
a grateful for being little
attention. I have done here
that it is quite a pleasure
to be with her. I have
been here but to take a
walk & by going out and
very late in the
evening she does not
miss her presence.
I have most comfortable
and letters from all at
Windsor & good accounts.
