I was fearful that dear America would be disturbed by the high wind which has blown here last two days and therefore was less surprised than concerned that the account conveyed in your affectionate letter of yesterday is not so satisfactory as those which had been received the two preceding days. I am however inclined to hope from the length being opened and the Calm being free from Gun, that a gradual amendment is taking place, and I shall be most anxious to hear that the Doctor in the Ship has taken as good Effect as that in the Bed. I has succeeded in relieving dear America from the Burn which I grieve to think she continues to suffer.
