I have received both your kind letters of yesterday and thank you for having stated fully and candidly your Ideas and Wishes in regard to the Arrangements which may be most conducive to dear Amelie's Comfort, on her Return from Weymouth. - It has ever been my anxious Desire to come into any which can in any degree relieve her from Sickness or Embarrassment, & promote the Restoration of her Health, & being now aware of the real Object in view, nothing shall be wanting on my part to facilitate it, either with regard to her quiet, undisturbed Residence or to her constant Stay with her, and it shall be equally my Study not to commit either of you in any way. The Report which you have sent me, & that received from Frederick are, upon the whole more comfortable & satisfactory, & I sincerely hope that the System now pursued may have every Effect which is expected from it. While I readily admit the necessity of Doctor Cope's more constant Attendance, that you, my Dearest Mary, do not take in your Health from your uncessant & affectionate Attention to my poor suffering Amelie is no small consolation upon this Occasion to
